HIDDEN COTTAGE

estled in the stone cliffs above the Delaware River, Hidden Cottage was built in 1840 shortly after completion of the Delaware Canal. The present owners have done extensive renovations to the kitchen and living spaces since purchasing the property in 2012. The exterior gardens featuring an enclosed front courtyard and a koi pond complement the dramatic interiors.



OLD GLORY

This home sits on the banks of the Delaware River towpath. Once a tavern, ■ the 1740 portion of the house was later enlarged to accommodate travelers. In 2004, a former congressman and his family purchased Old Glory, and in 2010 completed a 5100 square foot addition, which complements the original architecture while taking advantage of the beautiful river setting.











JERICHO Mountain ORCHARDS

The 17th century log cabin origins of this gracious home are clearly visible in the hand-hewn walls and walk-in fireplace of the dining room. The grounds of Jericho Mountain Orchards are spectacular and inspired a generation of Bucks County landscape painters including Daniel Garber. The restored barn and gorgeous gardens along with charming house is Bucks County living at its finest.



■ pleased to be collaborating with *Bucks County* Audubon Society at Honey Hollow, and Heritage Conservancy to present Tuckamony Farm. This

property sits in the environmentally significant 700 acre Honey Hollow Watershed which was designated by the U.S. State Department of Interior as a National Historic Landmark in 1969, and is home to four generations of the family that steward it for future generations. The stone homestead, also known as the Isaac Pickering House, remains much as it did centuries ago with great care taken to preserve the original unspoiled qualities of the house when installing heat, electric and plumbing. The land and buildings of Tuckamony Farm have been donated to the Heritage Conservancy. Jeffrey Marshall, president of the Conservancy lauded it as, "...perhaps the ost pure example of an 18th century stone farmhouse in Bucks Cour



▲ a land grant from King Charles II to William Penn, whose signature is on the original deed. The house dates back to 1765 and the blacksmith shop was the original forge of Bucks County, where George Washington is said to have had his horses shod and wagons repaired. The entire residence and barn have been totally restored to historic perfection.



PARRY MANSION MUSEUM

Ticket holders are invited to a free guided tour of the Parry Mansion Museum presented by the New Hope Historical Society from 1:00 to 5:00 on house tour day.

The Parry Mansion was built in 1784 by Benjamin Parry, one of New Hope's founders. The house has the distinction of having been occupied Parry family ownership ended in 1966 when Margaret Parry Lang sold the Mansion to the New Hope Historical Society.
